# Julie Hutt Student Scholarship 2024

Julie Hutt joined the New Zealand Veterinary Nursing
Association (NZVNA) Executive Committee (then council)
in 2002.

While volunteering hundreds of hours of her time over 20 years on the Executive Committee, she held the President position for ten of these. On top of this, Julie was also working full-time teaching veterinary nursing students as well as working part-time in a veterinary clinic.

In 2012, Julie was quoted in the New Zealand Veterinary Nurse Journal "strive to be the best you can be and keep on learning! Strive to further your knowledge through all avenues available and become invaluable to your practice, your clients and their pets".

The NZVNA recognises Julie's contribution to the development of future veterinary nurses in Aotearoa New Zealand and her encouragement to those wishing to upskill from their current qualification to the next level of qualification and has established a scholarship in her name.

### **Selection Criteria**

The NZVNA Executive Committee will appoint a panel annually that will review the applications for content and compliance and submit their recommendations to the NZVNA Executive Committee.

The panel may consist of NZVNA Executive Committee members, NZVNA sub-committee members and individual personal (non NZVNA member) that the NZVNA Executive Committee deem appropriate for the panel.

### **Terms and Conditions**

- Failure to meet any of the requirements set out in the NZVNA Student Scholarship application as well as these terms and conditions will result in rejection of the application, a decision made entirely at the discretion of the NZVNA and scholarship selection panel.
- Applications must be emailed to <u>president@nzvna.org</u>.
   <u>nz</u> and received no later than 5:00pm on Friday 26th of January 2024.
- A successful applicant is not eligible to reapply for the NZVNA Student Scholarship in subsequent years.
- NZVNA Executive Committee retain the right to contact the successful recipient's education provider to confirm enrolment and expenses related to the qualification.

The successful recipient must be:

- Enrolled in an Allied Veterinary Professional programme of study that is recognised by the NZVNA
- · A current, financial member of the NZVNA
- A NZ citizen or permanent resident currently residing in New Zealand
- The scholarship will be used toward course related fees, textbooks or travel required for the enrolled programme.
- The successful recipient will give NZVNA permission to confirm enrolment and course expenses with their education provider.
- The education may be offered through a recognised institution in New Zealand.
- Payment of monies in this scholarship will be awarded on confirmation of enrolment into the programme of study.
- The monies awarded with this scholarship must be spent within 12 months of receiving this award or the scholarship will be classed as null and void.
- Proof of payment must be provided to the NZVNA.
